

DIKALO (meaning 'message' in the Douala language from Cameroon) is given by the jury for best feature film, short film, documentary, and best actor and actress.

In addition, the public also award a dikalo. The quality of the films selected by the FIFP since the creation of the Dikalo Award in 2006, coupled with the excellent work of the professionals who make up the panel of judges, gives our festival world-wide recognition. Indeed, all the films chosen by the FIFP have had an excellent international success, such as Rigoberto Lopez, first winner of the Dikalo Award in 2006, a great Cuban director who left his mark on Pan-African film with his beautiful "Roble de Olor - Parfum Of Oak".






